INTRODUCTION OF THE BOOK

In this book, children discover body part vocabulary through 14 animals with unique and fascinating characteristics. As they explore each page, they continue practising question and negative sentences with the be verb by identifying which animal each body part belongs to.

The book also includes a fun drawing section where children can create their own animal body parts — a perfect way to build confidence, creativity, and language skills all at once!

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Children will be able to:

- Name common body parts in English
- Ask and answer yes/no questions — 'Is that your ~?' / 'Yes, it is' / 'No, it's not'
- Identify which body part belongs to which animal
- Use creative drawing to reinforce vocabulary

LEARNING ACTIVITIES

1. Practise questions and negative sentences

All the text in this book is designed to be accessible for young readers, so encourage your child to read each page aloud with confidence. Make it a fun goal to become fluent at asking 'Is that a ~?' and responding with 'Yes, it is' or 'No, it's not.'

2. Explore animals with unique body parts

As you read through the book, ask questions like: 'Which animal has unique ears?', 'Which animal has a unique nose?', or 'Which animal has unique eyes?' Encourage your child to think about what makes each animal's body special before turning the page.

3. Play the Speed Game

Invite your child to write a list of all the body part words in the book and read through them as quickly as possible. Repeated practice builds automaticity, boosts confidence, and reinforces vocabulary recall.

4. Create your own creature

Let your child draw their own imaginary creature with unique body parts from different animals. Once finished, ask them to present their artwork to you — describing each body part and which animal it comes from. This is a wonderful way to combine creativity with language practice.

FOLLOW-UP ACTIVITIES

Ask your child to draw one animal from the book and label its body parts in English. Then take turns asking 'Is that your ~?' about each part — your child will love quizzing you back!

TEACHER'S NOTES & TIPS

The drawing activity in this book is particularly effective for kinaesthetic learners who retain vocabulary better when they can create something physical. Encourage children to label their drawings in English as they go. For the 'create your own creature' activity, display the finished artwork and let children describe their creature to the group — this builds both vocabulary and speaking confidence.
